### Description & Benefits

Biff is a hard floor cleaner and maintainer that can be used on tile areas in kitchens, bathrooms, foyers and other common areas. Biff is a high performance degreasing detergent to remove slippery oils, fats and food spillages in commercial kitchens, bar areas and common areas in food service applications. Biff works better with warm / hot water to aid in the removal of fats and grease from surfaces. Biff contains a very light pine fragrance to reduce odours.

### Directions for use

**Machine Areas & light duties:** Dilute 20mls per 1L of hot /warm water. **Medium to heavy soiling:** Dilute 50mls per 1L of hot/warm water. **Heavy Grease and grime:** test a lower dilution on an inconspicuous area or contact your sales technician. If using on glass or aluminium, please use at higher dilution rates and test on small areas prior to ensure etching does not occur. Do not use on timber or highly polished floors and tiles and do not apply to Vinyl floors with sealers as the sealer may be damaged.

### Precautions
